4th And 5th Grades Trip To The Dairy

The 4C and 5A grades visited Farmers' Dairy April 25, 1950. Most of us think of the dairy only as a place to get ice cream and milk. We did not realize the amount of work and preparation that went on before the milk and ice cream reached us.

Mr. Cobb took us through the building where we saw many different machines. He showed us how the milk cans and bottles were scrubbed and cleaned in the automatic washing machine. Next, we saw the room where the milk is weighed. Mrs. Schadt showed us the laboratory when the milk is tested for butter fat content and bacteria. Then he showed us large storage tanks where the milk is stored and later pasteurized. We saw the automatic bottle filler, where the milk is capped and sealed.

Next we saw the "dream room" where they make ice cream. They gave us some ice cream and we thanked them very much.
