Lincoln Tigers Become Champs

Lincoln Tigers defeated Dunn Hornets Friday night, November 18, 1961 to become the Eastern Champions in the 2-A division. The Tigers will meet Hickory Wednesday night to play for the State Championship of the Eastern and Western Division.

Quarterback Fred Baldwin scored one touchdown and threw passes to end John Jones for the other two TD's as undefeated Lincoln High defeated Harnett High of Dunn here Friday night, 24-6, to win the Eastern Class 2-A Conference championship.

Wilber Farrar ran across one two-point conversion and Johnny Baldwin ran over the other two pointers for Lincoln, which swept to its 11th consecutive victory of the season against no losses.

Harnett scored in the second quarter on an 18-yard touchdown pass from John Richards to Eugene Hines, and the visitors trailed only 8-6 at halftime.

But Coach W. D. Peerman's Lincoln eleven scored twice in the third quarter to put the decision on ice and advance into the State finals opposite the Monroe-Hickory winner.

Baldwin threw a 41-yard touchdown aerial to Jones in the first quarter and then came back and pitched a 13-yard scoring

aerial to Jones in the third period.

Baldwin himself swept around end 20 yards to paydirt for the other Lincoln TD.
