In addition to the programs listed above, the Continuing Education computer lab will be equipped with software that will assist students in the Human Resources Development program in preparing for employment, Basic Skills students develop literacy skills and GED students in preparing to take the high school equivalency exam.

The new computer lab will provide broad based training opportunities to meet a variety of needs within our service area. We consider the new computer facility to be a tremendous asset to our overall program.
