"WALL" OF WATER

Towering 70 feet, a "wall" of water believed to have been set in motion by a submarine disturbance, nearly proved disastrous to the Pacific liner Brush, 50 miles off the coast of Mexico recently. The captain of the ship described the approach of the strange freak of nature as an unbroken, black line near the horizon when first observed by the lookout. When its nature was discerned, the ship was made ready for the onrush of water. When the wall hit the Brush, the captain declared it was as if a huge hand had clasped the vessel and raised it into the air. There was not a breath of wind, but for six hours after the occurrence, the log of the ship shows, the Brush labored in swells equal to those off Cape Horn and was driven miles off its course.—Popular Mechanics Magazine.

LEGENDS OF THE HAWTHORN

UNCOVER EGYPTIAN TOWN

Palestine excavations carried out at Beisan, the Bethshean of the Old Testament, have resulted in the discovery of substantial Egyptian buildings with evidence of five centuries' occupation, and two large, clear monumental inscriptions of Seti I and Ramses II, respectively, according to a dispatch from Jerusalem. The inscriptions indicate military dispositions of known divisions of Egyptian troops, and give references to neighboring cities on both sides of the Jordan. Beisan is a small town near the Jordan, 55 miles north-north-east of Jerusalem. Seti I was king of Egypt of the nineteenth dynasty, about 1366 B. C. He was the father of Ramses II.

JAPANESE FISHERIES

The interest taken by the business community of Japan in the fisheries negotiations with Russia will be understood when it is realized that the value of the products of Japanese fishermen in Russian waters is 30,000,000 yen annually.

There are more than 1,000 sailing and steam trawlers engaged in the industry, and about 18,000 small boats. Japanese men and women engaged number 20,000. There are six fishing grounds, one on the coast of the maritime province, where salmon, trout, herring and crabs are taken, and five on the coast of Kamchatka, where the catches are similar, but runs occur later in the season.
