(Continued From Front Page) trating the use of good land and the use of a sound farm plan." Mr. Mitchell stated, "The farm plan includes a simple, practical farm crop rotation for each family-size unit of the project. Each family-size farm has been laid out in equal size fields with crops to be grown that are best adapted to the type of soil found on the farm. Livestock has been planned for each unit adequate to furnish the farm food supply, to till the land in good manner, and also to furnish a source of farm income. Each unit has two acres set aside for a subsistence garden, small fruits and orchard. The practical farm plan developed for each unit

will enable the farmer occupying it to produce a maximum amount of home-consumable goods, to maintain and improve soil fertility of the farm and to produce sufficient cash crops to provide cash living and operating expenses and money with which to retire his loan."

The farms average 50 or 60 acres each and will cost the settlers from \$150 to \$200 per year over a period of 40 years. Farmhouses being constructed are of the four, five and six-room type, of frame construction, complete with electric wiring, plumbing and fireplace. A barn, poultry house and hog house will be provided each unit. Ten miles of road will be graded, ditched and graveled and forty culverts will be laid. Water will be obtained from individual driven wells, 25 feet deep,

with electric pump, tank and pump house. Sewage disposal will be through individual septic tanks with tile drain field. Twenty-five miles of transmission and distribution and distribution lines will be constructed to provide electric light and power.

Regional Director Mitchell stated that the North Carolina Rural Rehabilitation Corporation of the FERA which secured the first options on land in this area has

worked hand in hand with his organization and deserves much credit for the original selection of this project area. Before the Resettlement Administration decided to make a Rural Resettlement project, the RR Corporation had leased a considerable acreage with option to purchase and had placed on the land a number of Rehabilitation families who worked it as tenants, under the Rehabilitation loans.
