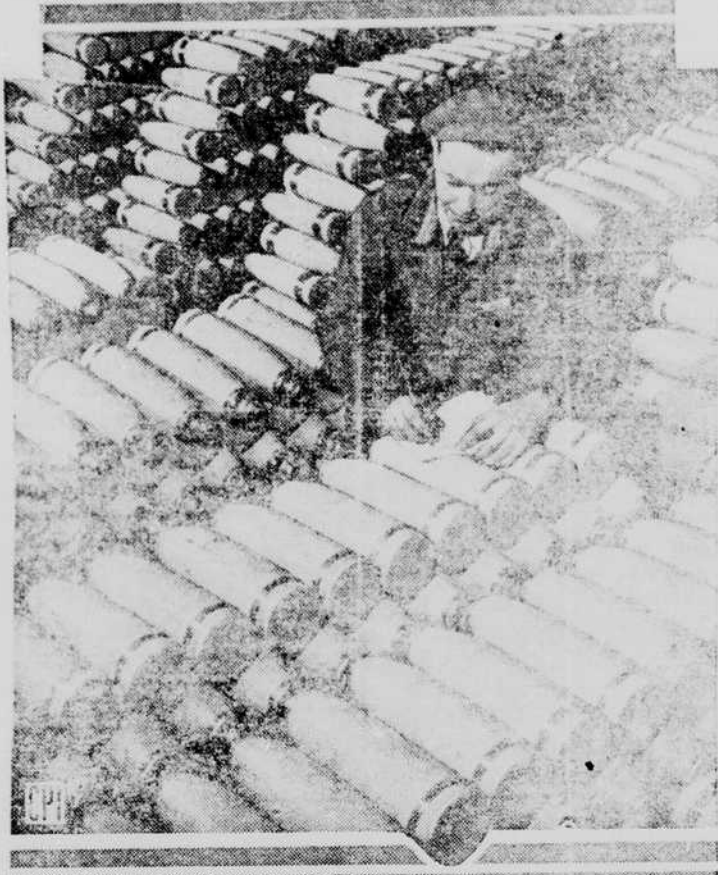


Howitzer Shells For Hitler



THIS small corner of a munitions plant somewhere in Canada which is manufacturing howitzer shells gives an idea of the vast munitions program upon which the Dominion is engaged. In the manufacture of shells, chemicals and explosives, Canada has assumed a position of supreme importance in the war. Nine of the Dominion's twelve chemical and explosive plants (one of them the largest in the British Empire) are producing and the

balance will be in operation soon. This year alone, the total production of explosives in Canada should exceed the entire Canadian output during the whole of the 1914-18 World War. In the munitions plants, nine types of gun ammunition are being produced at a rate of millions of rounds per year. About forty per cent of the total national income of Canada this year will be spent by the Dominion for her own military needs and to give financial aid to Great Britain.

1,000,000 Working Hours Salvaged During Year 1941

Chapel Hill, January 6. -- Over 1,000,000 working days were salvaged in 1941 for the war of production through group hospital planning, it was disclosed here today by officials of the Hospital Saving Association of North Carolina.

The information came from the American Hospital Association in a report of activities of the 68 non-profit hospital service plans which operate across the nation under the Blue Cross insignia of that organization. The 1,000,000 working days which were poured back into the country's war effort came as the result of prompt and adequate hospitalization of ailing workers, enabling them to return to their vital machines with a minimum of lost time.

Defense officials, through Social Security Administrator Paul V. McNutt, offered praise to the Blue Cross plans in their fight against the toll of American illness. McNutt of icially endorsed group hospital planning for employer and employees as an important factor in the fight for production. He pointed out the national problem which arises from sickness and the heavy financial burden it imposes on industry and the taxpayer.

He urged prepayment of hospital bills whenever possible through group planning. "Without group planning," said McNutt, "many persons are now compelled to forego necessary hospital care or obtain it in tax supported institutions."

Under strict standards of approval, the American Hospital Association sponsors a non-profit hospital service plans with a total membership of over 8,000,000 workers and their families. Ranking thirteenth among these, with headquarters in Chapel Hill, the Hospital Saving Association of North Carolina now has more than

The associations extend credit to their farmer members for almost every purpose for which a farmer needs short term credit.
