

An Ordinance Authorizing Blackouts, Orders, Rules and Regulations Pertaining Thereto, and Prescribing The Penalty For Violation Thereof.

WHEREAS, the United States of America is now engaged in war with foreign powers and in modern warfare and no town is free from attack; and

WHEREAS, lights during night time are a definite aid to the enemy in reaching military and other objectives; and

WHEREAS, blackouts and air raid warnings when ordered are essential to the preservation of life and this town, and it is necessary for the town to aid the armed forces and to protect as far as possible the property and lives of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, failure to extinguish lights when ordered by the authorized authorities may result in loss of life by many residents of the town.

THE FORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF WELDON:

SECTION 1. In order to protect life and property in the Town of Weldon, the Mayor and District Air Raid Warden are authorized and directed to provide for and carry out blackouts and air raid warnings in said town at such times as such blackouts and warnings may be deemed necessary, and particularly for as such periods as may be ordered by the military and naval forces; and the Mayor and District Air Raid Warden are authorized and directed to prescribe such orders, rules and regulations as may be necessary to insure the success of blackouts and air raid warnings and to protect life and property at such periods. Such rules and regulations may include those affecting fire police, and highways, and measures protecting life and property, including drills and instructions, and using the services of citizens of the town as well as law enforcement agencies in the enforcement of such rules and regulations.

SECTION 2. The Mayor and District Air Raid Warden may appoint for a specified time special guards wardens and police, without pay, from the residents of the Town of Weldon, as may be deemed necessary for service in connection with any blackout period and or air raid warning period, and during the term of such special

service they shall possess the powers and privileges and perform the duties of peace officers in the town. Said special guards, wardens and police must wear such identifying emblem as may be prescribed, and it shall be unlawful for any such special officer to attempt to carry out any order, rule or regulation or perform any duty promulgated under the authority of this ordinance when not wearing said identifying emblem and when not on special duty as herein authorized.

SECTION 3. When deemed necessary in order to protect life and property during a blackout, the police and the special officers authorized herein are authorized to enter upon any premises within the Town of Weldon and extinguish lights thereon.

The Town of Weldon shall not be liable for any damage sustained to persons or property during a blackout or air raid warning.

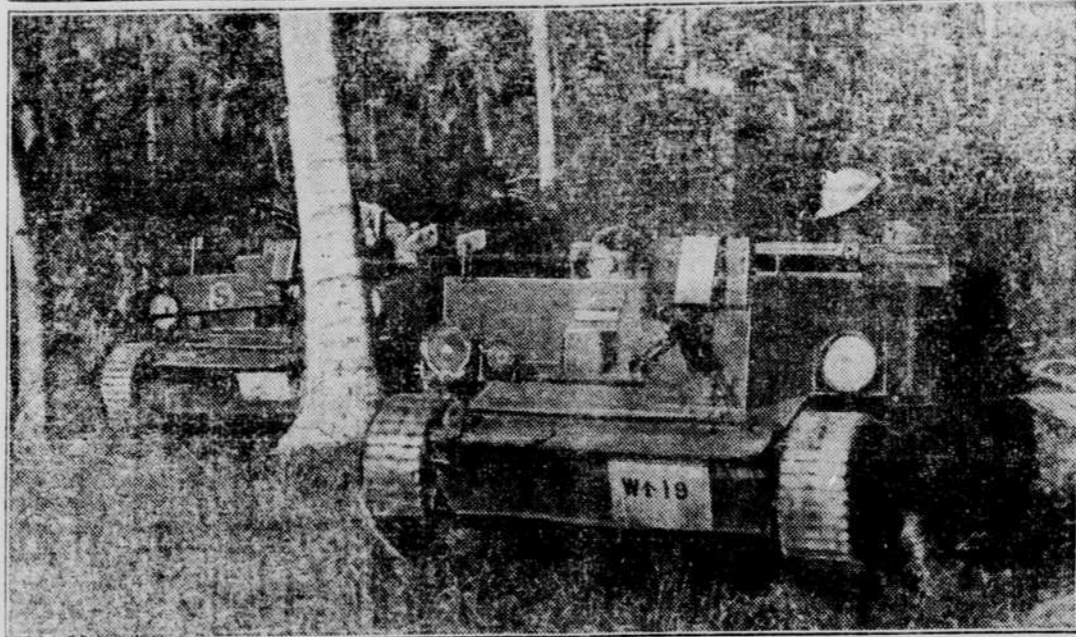
SECTION 4. This ordinance constitutes an exercise of a governmental function by the Town of Weldon for and in the interest of the protection of the public peace and safety of citizens and property within said town, and neither the said town nor persons working under the regulations hereof and under the authority hereby granted and or called upon to assist in enforcing the provisions of this ordinance by virtue of said authority, shall be liable for damages in connection therewith.

SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Town Commissioners that each provision of this ordinance shall be deemed independent of other provisions hereof, and that if any provisions of this ordinance is declared to be invalid all other provisions shall remain in force and effect.

SECTION 6. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance or any order or rule or regulation issued under the provisions hereof shall be subject to a penalty of \$50.00 for each and every offense and violation.

SECTION 7. This ordinance is declared to be in the interest of public safety and shall be in force
