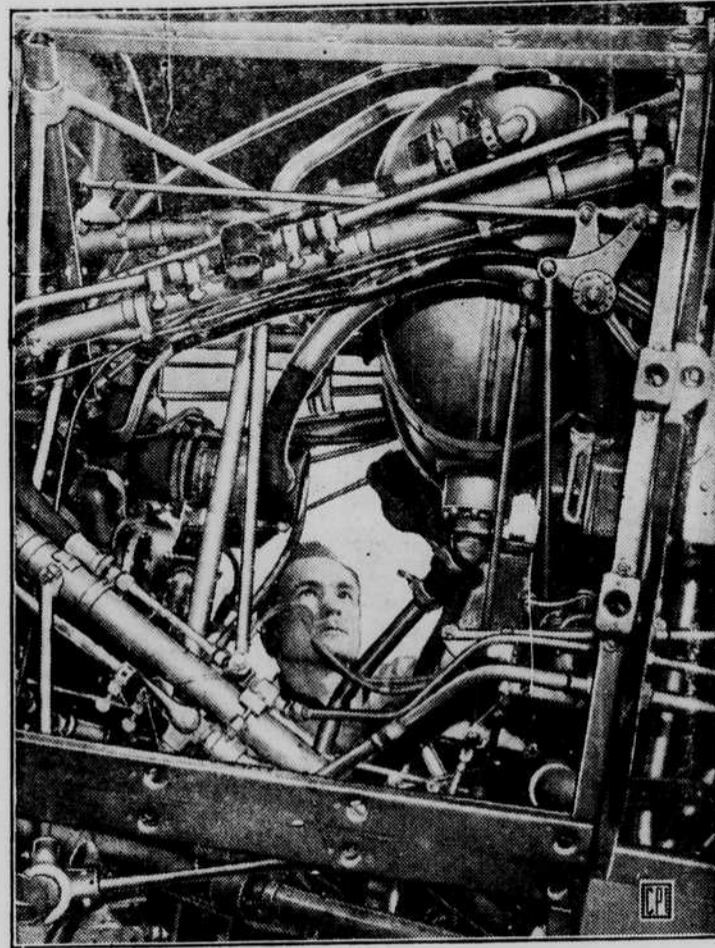

IT KEEPS THEM FLYING



NEW sections of aircraft demonstrate elaborate construction so graphically as this motor and fuselage assembly of the Canadian-built Harvard, swift single-motor training craft of the Royal Canadian Air Force. An advanced trainer, the Harvard is used as the pursuit plane prototype in the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan, and is one of the most popular craft of the many used during training. Harvards are built in a brand new plant, under contract from the Department of Munitions and Supply, where hundreds of workers, many of whom are women, are employed. This factory also produces the rugged, dependable all-purpose "Norseman" of Canadian design and manufacture.

At the present time, Canada is looking after a substantial part of the requirements of the Air Training Plan. It is building operational planes for the Royal Canadian Air Force, and it has accepted substantial orders for training and service planes from England and the United States. With a current production of more than 400 planes a month, which would compare with a production of some 5,000 a month in the United States, Canada is therefore now looking after a substantial part of the requirements of the Joint Air Training Plan. To simplify and speed up the output, the manufacture of aircraft in Canada is now confined to nine types as compared with the 15 types which, at one time or another, have been in production. These are: an elementary trainer, the Fairchild Cornell; a single-engine advanced trainer, the North American Harvard; a twin-engine advanced trainer, the Canadian Anson; a twin-engine reconnaissance bomber and bombing and gunnery trainer, the Bristol Bolingbroke; a coastal reconnaissance amphibian, the PBV3 Catalina; a single-engine fighter, the Hurricane; a twin-engine fighter, a four-engine long range bomber, and a navy dive bomber.

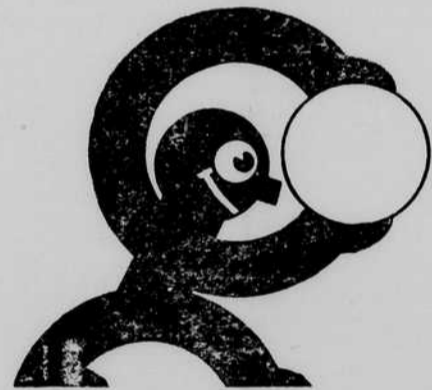
