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## Halifax County Farm And Home News

**Home Demonstration Agent**  
New Price Ceilings--On May 17 new price ceilings were established on eggs, poultry, butter and pork. These all affect farm family sales and should be investigated. If you do not have prices see you ration board or Mr. Bruce of the Soil Conservation Division who represents the War Board in meat rationing. This is important as you must stay within the set prices.

**New Regulations on Selling Rationed Foods by Farmers.** All farm families who sell butter and meats must keep a record of the amount sold and collect the required number of points. At the end of each month you must turn in your record and collected points to the local ration board. Ration points are collected from retailers and institutions as well as consumers. Yes, it is a big bother but has to be done for the good of all. Someday we hope the war will be over, but in the meantime if you are in doubt about procedure ask someone who knows.

**Sugar for Canning.** Sugar for canning may be gotten now by applying for your local ration board. When you go to make your application take with you all the family Ration Books No. 1, a list of the number of quarts of fruits canned last year, number of qts. of vegetables canned last year and the number you now have on hand. Also take an estimation of the canning that you expect to do this year of both fruits and vegetables. This information compiled in advance will help both you and the Ration Board.

Remember that strawberries are now on hand and blackberries and huckleberries will soon be ready. We advise saving all these that is possible as orchards fruits will be extremely short. Be prepared to can the berries when they are ready is only a good business policy.

**Fats for Defense.** It seems that there has been some trouble with disposing of the fats that has been salvaged. Housewives should turn in fats to local groceries. Grocers in turn may dispose of fats to the North Carolina Consolidated Hide Company, Inc., Goldsboro, North Carolina. All the grocerman has to do is to write to the above company and they will send a truck by to pick up his stock of Defense Fat.

Salvaging fat is becoming more and more important for munitions. No fraction of good fat should be allowed to waste. We should all work together to help in this way. As reserve supplies of fats are used the production and salvaging greases take on more significance.

### Halifax County War Board

The farmers of Halifax County will be interested in knowing some thing about recent rulings of Office of Price Administration concerning keeping of records and the turning in of red stamps in connection with the sale of meat products, butter and cheeses. According to our latest instructions, farmers making sales in this county will be required to turn in a report of their total sales together with the red rationing points to the local Office of Price Administration at the end of a reporting period which may be chosen as to length of such period by the farmer. Such reporting periods should not run over 4 or 5 weeks making it necessary that 12 reports be made a year. The War

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
