### Farm News

Board is sending to each farmer in the county, selling meat products and butter, a letter of instructions and an OPA Form R-1604. If you sell butter or meat products, be sure to report on this form and turn the stamps with this form over to your local OPA Office at the end of the pay-

period which you may use as a reporting period. If you have received your form together with a letter of instructions, please return your local War Board OPA Office at once.

The War Board has received instructions that all farmers sell meat either fresh or cured and have a permit to make such meat, both cured and fresh meat, and butter during the month of May.

### GRASS SILAGE

The "wilting" method of making grass silage, without use of molasses or acid preservatives requires that the moisture content of the chopped material be reduced below 68 per cent.

The Wheat Export Program, which payments have been made for wheat exported to designated foreign countries, suspended by the War Food Administration on May 14.

The Bureau of Agriculture has advised hog producers not to increase breeding for the 1943 fall pig crop more than 15 percent over the number of fall pigs raised in 1942.
