"The practice of many farmers in confining their pigs to floored pens and feeding them rations composed chiefly of grains brings about mineral deficiencies," says Smith. "In some cases, after two or three months of such feeding, the pigs have difficulty in getting up and walking to the feed trough." He recommends that the pigs be given a mineral mixture of equal parts of ground phosphate, steamed bone meal or defluorinated phosphate, and common salt. This mixture may be left so that the pigs may take it at will. For self feeding, the mineral mixture is made more tempting by mixing a pound of tankage or meat scrap to nine pounds of the mixture.

Grains may also be supplemented with a good grade of legume hay at the rate of 5 to 10 percent for fattening hogs, and 10 to 15 percent for sows and boars," Smith says. He points out that sun-dried hay is more effective than artificially cured hay because it contains more vitamin D. Sun-cured, legume hay provides good protein, calcium, phosphorus and other necessary minerals and vitamins.

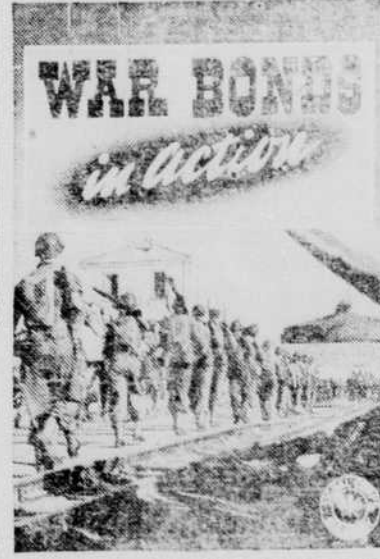
### State Raises Over \$3 Million In Drive
