Reduce Flea Beetle
Damage On Tobacco

Research studies by the State
College Experiment Station have
demonstrated that tightly con-
structed tobacco plant beds will
protect the seedling plants from
much of the damage caused by
flea beetles, according to Direc-
tor L. D. Baver of Raleigh.
The protection of newly set to-

beetle plants by means of single
applications of insecticides, either
in the plant bed just before
pulling or in the field immedi-
ately after setting, has been given
attention by the research men.
The tests show promise of an eco-
nomical means of protecting
small plants from flea beetle
damage during the critical stage.
If the plant beds are destroyed
after transplanting to the field,
it will remove a prolific breeding
place from which flea beetles
move to the fields, the scientists
point out.
It was shown that fall plowing
and cutting of tobacco stalks af-
ter priming will prevent the build
up of infestations of hornworms.
