Shaw To Join Staff Coble Dairy Farms

Dr. A. O. Shaw, head of the an imal industry department at State College since March 1942, has resigned his position at the college and will become superitnendent of the Cobb Dairy Farms near Lexington, Davidson County, on July

Agricutural Experiment Sta* in announcing Shaw's resign stated that he will be ten succeeded by Dr. Walter J. Peter-son, chief of the animal nutrition section, until a new head can be chosen for the department

Dr. Shaw was reared on a ferr in southern Idaho and did his college work at the University of Idaho, at Pennsylvania State College, and at Kansas State College. where he was associate head of the dairy department beftre coming to North Carolina.

Dr. Baver expressed his regrets at losing Dr. Shaw from the staifs of the Experiment Station and State College but stated that he was glad that the livestock expert would remain in the state for consultation and advice on matters affecting the livest industry.

In his new position, Dr. Shaw will have the responsibility of developing not only a sound breeding program with the 450 purebred animals in the Coble herds but also management and feeding practices best adapted to that section of North Carolina.

"During his stay at State College, Dr. Shaw has organized a well rounded program of research and one of the best animal industry staffs inthe country," Dr. Baver commented.
