THE COMMON DEFENSE

Penalty for Defying God's Law

A statement by the German Confessional Church, issued in May 1944 and reprinted in October by the Religious Division of the British Ministry of Information, affirms that in Germany "there is a growing uncertainty as to whether the Ten Commandments are still to be considered valid."

Alarmed by this state of affairs the Church warns Christians that "we, as Christians, must not pervert the word of God, nor call that which is good bad; we dare not allow the truth to be called foolish and wrong. We must not magnify human laws and regulations as though they were ordered by God."

This is quite evidently a slap at the Nazis whose laws, as the Confessional statement shows, have denied ever yone of the Ten Commandments. Speaking of the Nazis' violation of the Sixth Commandment the statement says, "Woe to us and our nation when we make little of the life that God has given, and man, whom God created in His image, is only assessed as to his utility; when it is considered right to take life because human beings are considered as of no value, or because they belong to another race, when hatred and cruelty are the order of the day. For God says: 'Thou shalt not kill.'"

This is strong language. Others may want to overlook the events that prompted it. But Americans cannot. We cannot but agree with the words of the Archbishop of York on October 12th when he said

that "the wholesale asphyxiation or machine-gunning of tens of thousands including children and women, the death trains, the wiping out of whole villages like Lidice and Oradour . . . are crimes which we have no right to pass over."

The German Christians know the price a nation pays when it de-

parts from the law of God. They know the responsibility that Christians bear for the fall of a nation when they, seeing how God's law is flouted, do nothing to stand up to their convictions that "God's commandments apply to us and our time." They know what some of us have yet to learn - that when we permit or participate in the hatred and persecution of Jews, or members of any other

group of people, we are inviting not only disaster for them and ourselves, but also the breakdown of the whole moral structure of society.
