USAir pilot lands safely on one wheel

After losing a wheel shortly after takeoff, a USAir jet circled Raleigh-Durham International Airport for 20 minutes before flying to Charlotte and landing safely at Douglas International Airport.

The plane, a Fokker 100 used by USAir since 1990, took off from Raleigh-Durham at 8:43 a.m. on Feb. 22, but 10 minutes later, the pilot announced to passengers that he was returning to Raleigh-Durham to check out a problem with the landing gear.

A passenger on a Midway flight headed to New York reportedly saw one of the USAir plane's left wheels drop off, and notified the Midway pilot. The pilot alerted the airport control tower, which contacted the USAir crew.
