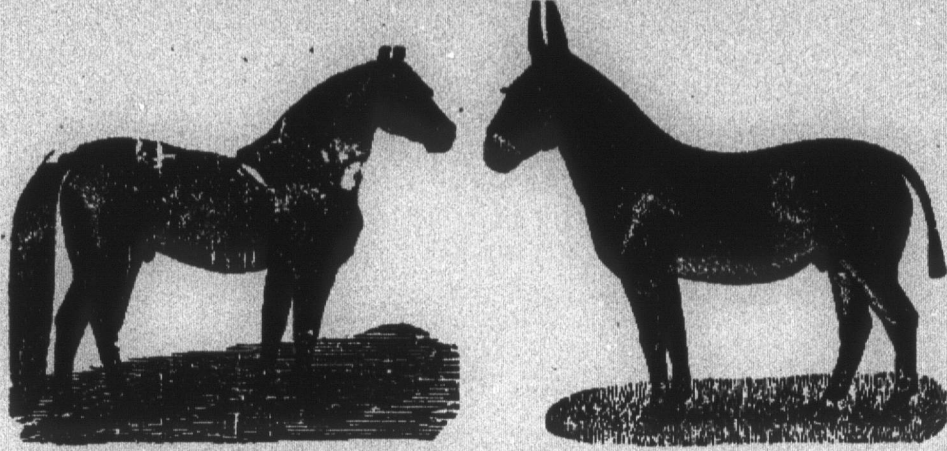

### Things Worth Knowing.

Wiley Rogers, of Raleigh, has been indicted for driving a horse to death.

The coal miners strike out west is assuming enormous proportions, and is becoming serious.

The hot weather through the north and west is almost unbearable. Many deaths have resulted.

The town Lowry, Minn., was almost completely destroyed by a cyclone last week. Many persons were killed.

Stewart Bros., of Winston, N. C., late State Printers, have been sued to recover a large sum of money, which it is claimed they overcharged for work done.

The convicts in the penitentiary had an old fashion celebration on the 4th. They gave a minstrel show, had a base ball game, and an elaborate dinner was served.

The new directors of the North Carolina Railroad, appointed by Gov. Russell, have assumed the duties of their office, and elected Dr. W. C. Norment, president.

Gov. Russell pardoned, last week, Fernando Bullock, convicted of assault with a deadly weapon in Pitt Supreme court, April, 1896, and sentenced to twelve months in jail.

Texas will raise this year over 3,000,000 bales of cotton, the corn crop will be the largest in the history of the State, while the wheat crop, already harvested, is large and being sold at a profitable price.

Revenue officers this afternoon brought in 28 barrels and 19 kegs of whiskey and six stills, the property of Robert Cooke, who has been operating a government distillery in Davis county for several years.

The seizure was made because the manufacturer had the whiskey hidden on his place when it should have been in the warehouse stamped.

In Ireland, the other day, when the charitable societies of Limerick began to distribute a hundred carcasses of mutton, part of the Australian jubilee gift to the poor of the united kingdom, a mob of women jeered the recipients, snatched the meat from them and trampled it in the mud. The other applicants were afraid to receive the mutton, and as a result it was returned to the stores. The action of the mob was due to their determination not to participate in any form in the queen's jubilee. England has been made happy by the jubilee, but Ireland is not yet ready to come to mutton.

There has been a bad feeling in Charleston, S. C. for several weeks over the superseding of the white labor in the cotton mill of that city by colored labor, the excuse for the change being that the white labor was not equal to the demand and not up to the standard in efficiency. Now, the News and Courier states that another large South Carolina mill is negotiating for the services of these discharged white employes and is ready to take forty families as soon as arrangements can be perfected for housing them. This will be a decided loss for Charleston.

President McKinley has sent a message to congress recommending a legislation providing for a commission to adjust the currency question of the country. The message quotes from the President's inaugural address, in which he said:

"Our financial system needs some revision; our money is all good now, but its value must not be further threatened. It should all be put on an enduring basis, not subject to easy nor its stability to doubt or dispute. Therefore I believe it necessary to devise a system which, without diminishing the circulating medium or offering a premium for its contraction, will put a remedy for these arrangements, which temporary in their nature, might well in the years of our prosperity, have been displaced by wiser provisions. With adequate revenue secured, but not until then, we can enter upon such changes in our fiscal laws, which, will while insuring safety and volume to our money, no longer impose upon the government the necessity of maintaining so large a gold reserve, with its attendant and inevitable temptations to speculation."

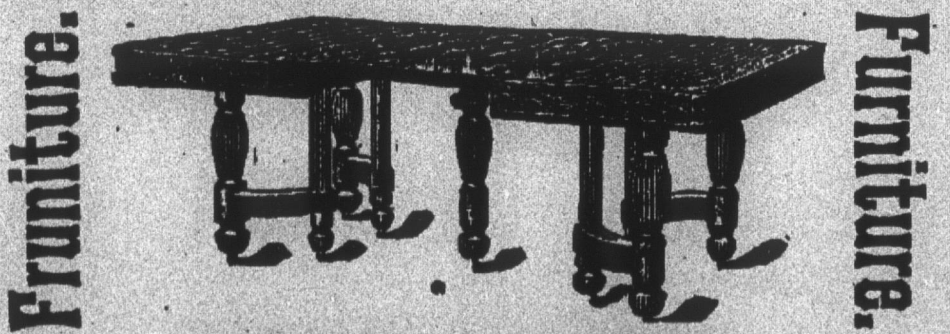
