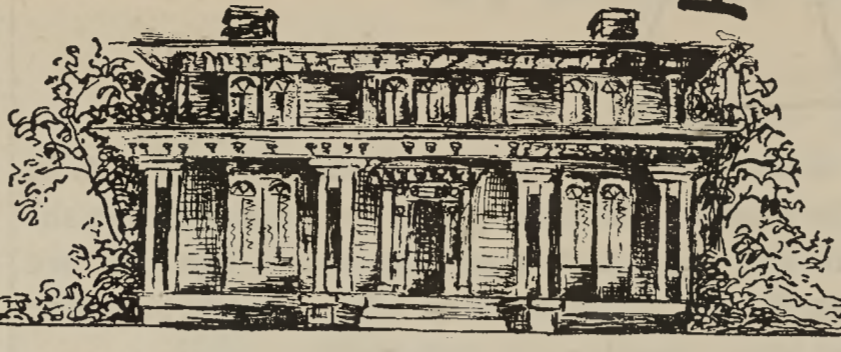

New Equipment Donated to School

Through the generosity of the Kiwanis and Rotary clubs and numerous townspeople, the Chapel Hill High School athletic teams are receiving this year more than \$500 worth of new equipment.

The drive to raise the money was started several weeks before school began when Mr. Honeycutt made a plea in behalf of the school to the two organizations. Both responded eagerly and, after collecting donations from within the clubs, canvassed the town for further contributions.

Football equipment such as shoulder pads, helmets, hip pads and pants, has already been purchased at the cost of \$500.

According to Mr. Cannon, chairman of the donations committee, purchase of new equipment will not end with the football team but will be extended to the basketball and baseball squads.

C. E. Buckner Dies In Duke Hospital

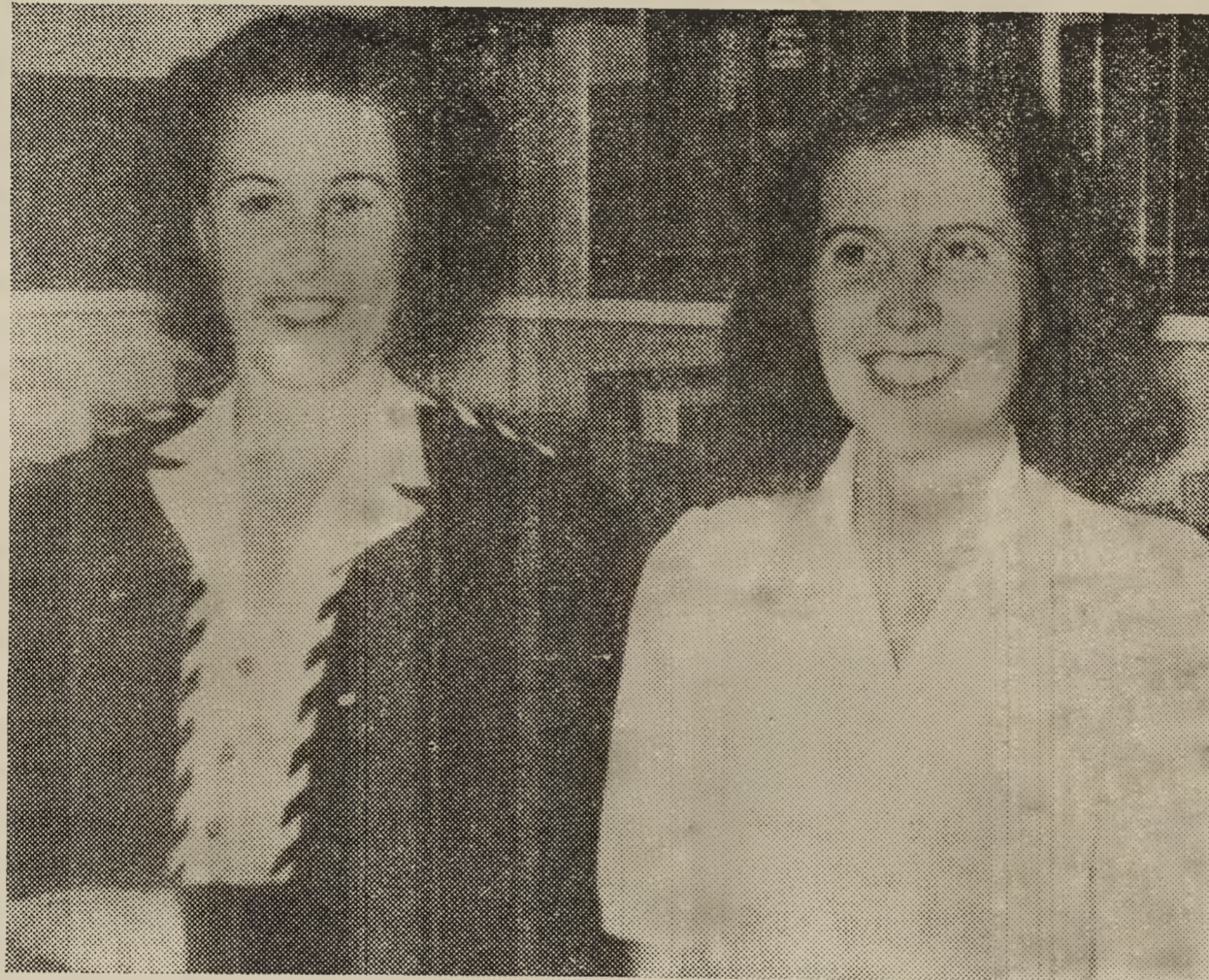
Mr. C. E. Buckner, principal of Chapel Hill High School, 1942-44, died last Friday night in Duke Hospital from an internal hemorrhage.

Mr. Buckner came to Chapel Hill from Brevard College, where he was dean of men. Prior to this he had been principal of Burlington and East Durham High Schools. He was a graduate of Duke University, holding an A.B. and an M.A. degree. At the time of his death he was instructing in the V-12 Unit and doing graduate work at the University of North Carolina.

Funeral services for the former principal were conducted at the family home Sunday afternoon.

Surviving Mr. Buckner are his wife; two sons, Edward and Bobby; one daughter, Beth.

The Chapel Hill High School Wildcats last Tuesday lost their second straight game of the season to Hillsboro High 28-0 as the contest that had twice been postponed was finally played on the Hillsboro gridiron.

Chapel Hill took the opening kickoff but could not gain. Carroll kicked and Hillsboro took over on their own forty-five. Eight plays later they scored after driving fifty-five yards as Mincey and Raynor continually tore large holes in the Wildcat line. The try for conversion was good and Hillsboro lead 7 to 0.

Chapel Hill took the following kickoff and opened up with their new passing attack. Two long passes up the middle to Smith netted the 'Cats twenty-five yards and a first down on the Hillsboro 45. Here, however, the Chapel Hill attack bogged down and Carroll
