Girl Cagers Beaten By Late Rally, 23-19

In their opening game of the 1945 season last Friday night the Chapel Hill girls' team was defeated by a strong Hillsboro six in a close contest, 23-19. The game was played in the women's gymnasium which afforded a much warmer site than the Tin Can.

Although they won, Hillsboro had to come from behind in the fourth quarter to do it, as Chapel Hill, riddled by injuries, weakened terribly.

The Hillians, led by Evelyn Merritt and Dot Hogan jumped to an early lead, and as the first quarter ended, were ahead, 5-4. Helen Phillips entered the game and scored three successive field goals to increase Chapel Hill's lead to 14-10 at half-time.

Hillsboro came back strong in the second half and pulled to within two points of overtaking the Hillians as the third quarter ended.

Chapel Hill's defense weakened by the loss of Hamilton, and having no capable replacements at guard, fell apart, and despite the efforts of Cashion, Merritt and Schulmerich, were unable to stop the strong Hillsboro rally.

High scorer for the night was Blackwelder of Hillsboro, with ten points. Evelyn Merritt was high scorer for Chapel Hill with eight points.

The starting line-up for Chapel Hill was Evelyn Merritt, Dot Hogan, and Betty Sparrow, forwards; and Cashion, Jackie Merritt, and Betty Schulmerich, guards.

Lack Of Entries Is Cause Of Action

The short story contest, originally deadlined December 16, will end Wednesday, January 17, Editor Cashion revealed today. The \$5 prize and publication awards will remain the same.

As was announced in the Proconian of December 7, any student in high school is eligible to enter a story of 500 to 800 words in the contest.

The original deadline was December 16, but students were so rushed by exams that the time limit has been extended to January 17 to give all an equal chance. Stories should be typed, if possible, and given to Editor Cashion before Wednesday.

Intended primarily to stimulate interest in the Proconian, the contest will result in publication of the winning story. In addition, a \$5 prize will be awarded to the winner.

Stories will be judged on the basis of originality, grammatical correctness, and clarity. Miss Mancini will read the stories for mechanical errors, and they will be judged by a faculty committee. Stories may be humorous or serious; that will not affect the decision of the judges.

The Proconian editors hope to stimulate interest in creative writing for print by offering these awards for superior craftsmanship.
