According to Mrs. Marie Holman, instructor, about 20 students are involved in the competition, which is sponsored by St. Regis Paper Co.

Entrants in the contest, which closes March 14, are asked to create a design for one of five types of packages—a multiwall bag for an industrial food product; a corrugated container for fresh vegetables; a flexible film wrap for a loaf of bread; a folding carton for toys; and a noholds-barred package using any, or all six, new materials for any type product.
