DOTS AND DASHES WINS HONORS

DOTS AND DASHES, Johnson Street School's newspaper, has received second prize in the 19th annual newspaper contest sponsored by Columbia Scholastic Press Association.

This is the second time the paper has received honors from the contest which includes entries from 44 states and 835 contestants.

Other North Carolina schools entering the contest and receiving awards were the E. K. Powe School, Durham, first award; and the Alexander Street School, Charlotte, third place.

STAMP SALES INCREASE

The Johnson Street School has sold \$3,697.10 worth of bonds and stamps from September 4 to March 2. The school has been 100% in buying bonds and stamps this year. Since Tuesday was set aside as Stamp Day on Jan. 12, there has been a steady increase in stamp sales. On Jan. 12 the school sold \$35.75 worth and on March 2 it sold \$107.30 worth. This makes three times the amount of the sale on Jan. 12.

This is a fine record and we want to have an even greater increase each week. Much of this success is due to Mrs. Clarence Schultheiss, P. T. A. Chairman of the War Program and also to the parents who have helped her.
