Immigration Law Study Backed

WASHINGTON — (NC) — The director of the Immigration Department of the National Catholic Welfare Conference strongly supported Congressional re-study of U.S. immigration laws.

John E. McCarthy told a subcommittee of the House Judiciary Committee that present laws espouse racial policies which, if applied in this country, "might well be held unconstitutional."

"An effective means should be found for issuing entrance documents to our country without regard to the ethnic origin, nation-

ality or race of those wishing to join this democratic brotherhood," McCarthy told the Immigration and Nationality Subcommittee. He was accompanied by Edmund Cummings, associate director of the NCWC department.

The subcommittee is considering a proposal by President Johnson to replace the national origins system of allotting immigration quotas. This bases each foreign nation's quota on the nation origin of U.S. citizens in 1920.
