Msgr. John F. Roueche offered the graduation Mass and the address was given by Father John Powers.

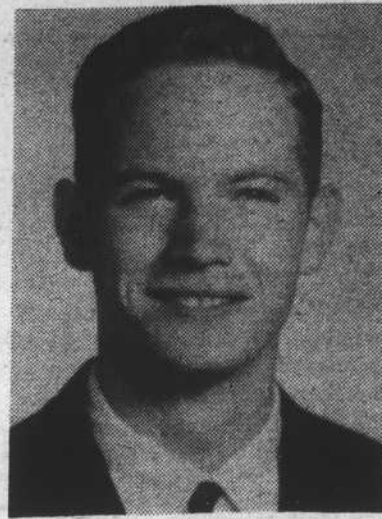
Among the 29 graduates of the class of 66, there were several seniors who were the recipients of scholarships from colleges around the country.

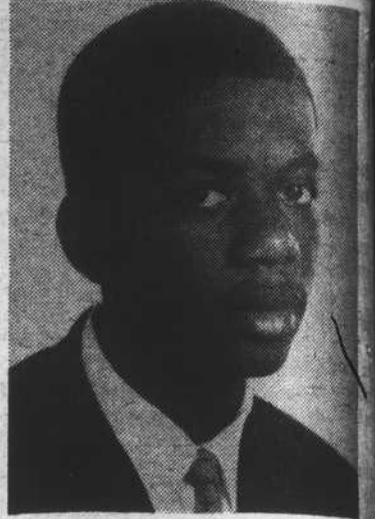

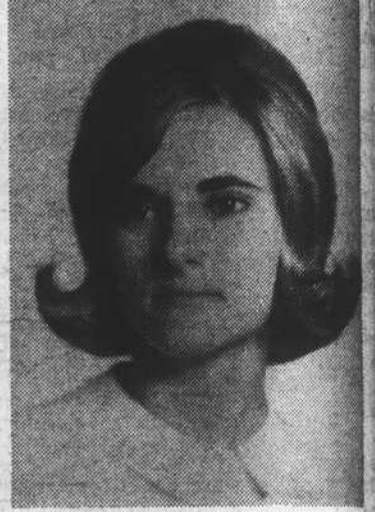
