Atlanta — (NC) — "Archbishop Paul J. Hallinan had the courage to take a bold step — that necessary, decisive step needed to bring the Church into the mainstream of contemporary life," the eulogist said.

"There may be some who say he was ahead of his time. Perhaps he was. But I think his genius was that he saw time was running out and he had the courage to take that bold step. It is for this reason that he was a prophetic figure. It is for this reason that his influence long will be felt."

Minneapolis — A unique "Stations of the Cross" procession was sponsored by Holy Name Church here.

Ask Hanoi Cease-Fire

New York —(NC)— The National Committee for a Political Settlement in Vietnam (formerly known as Negotiation Now), of which Auxiliary Bishop John J. Dougherty of Newark is a co-chairman, announced it welcomed President Johnson's action in partially halting the bombing of North Vietnam, and called on Hanoi to agree to negotiate and join in a full cease-fire.

These messages have been conveyed to both sides in cables from co-chairmen of the committee.

At a press conference here, Clark Kerr, former president of the University of California and a committee co-chairman, said the

cable to Ho Chi Minh pointed to a fundamental change in U.S. policy with declaration of American support for "political conditions that permit South Vietnamese — all South Vietnamese — to settle their own differences by free political choice rather than by war."
