## William J. Bundy, P.G.M., Dies Suddenly William L. Ramsey, Sr.

The members of the Masonic Craft and the North Carolina public generally were shocked at the news of the sudden death of Most Worshipful William J. Bundy, Past Grand Master, who died in Stavanger, Norway, on June 27, 1970. Brother Bundy was on a tour with a group of Shriners at the time of his death.

Funeral services were held in Jarvis Memorial United Methodist Church, Greenville, N. C. on Sunday, July 5 at 3 P.M.
