Summer School Begins June 9 To End July 18

Summer school will be held at RHS this summer from June 9 through July 18.

If a student enrolls he must attend the full 30 days. Make-up classes will be held five days a week, for 30 days and will last two and a half hours a day. If a student failed both semesters, class will be for 30 full days, five hours a day and 5 days a week.

A tuition of \$30 is charged for make-up subjects, and \$50 for a new subject. Classes will function from 7 a.m. to 12 noon. Also 2½ hour classes from 7:30 to 9:00 a.m.

RHS Band To Travel To Myrtle Beach Will Take Part In Sun Fun Festival
