

WILLIAMSTON - Due to the increasing local presence of seasonal flu, Martin General Hospital officials have implemented visitation restrictions.

Visitation restrictions include anyone who exhibits cold or flu-like symptoms, fever, diarrhea, vomiting or headaches. The restrictions do not apply to those in need of emergency

Children under age 12 will not be permitted in the hospital for visitation purposes. This is to minimize the spread of respiratory infections to hospital patients, employees, community and children under 12 years of age, according to hospital officials.

"Patients in the hospital have weakened immune systems, and it's our job to protect them from unnecessary exposure to germs," said John Jacobson, Interim Chief Executive Officer. "We recognize the importance of family support when a loved one is hospitalized, and we
