West 63 feet to a stone, corner of land now or formerly of Mrs. M. E. Simmons' heirs; thence with that line North 40 deg. West 63 feet to a stake, a new corner for Sarah Fleming Person; hence with the line of Sarah Fleming Person North 59 deg. East 63 feet to a stake Northeast corner of her lot in the Southern margin of Lee Street; thence along the Southern margin of Lee Street South 40 deg. East 63 feet to the BEGINNING, and being the Eastern portion of the lot conveyed by E. D. Tippet and wife to Sarah Fleming Person by Deed dated August 15, 1947, and recorded in Book 974, Page 61, Wake County Registry. See Deed to Elizabeth Fleming recorded in Book 1256, Page 190.
