Local Native Named
School Principal

George H. Young, a former resident of Wake Forest and son of the late Allen L. Young of Wake Forest, has been named principal of the new South Lumberton Jr. and Sr. High School which will open in the fall of 1965.

He received his elementary and high school training here in the local Presbyterian School. His college work was done at Johnson C. Smith University and Post Graduate work at Columbia University.

Young, a former teacher in the Wake County School system, became principal of the South Lumberton Elementary in 1942 and remained there until about two years ago when he took over the leadership at Hayswood High School following the death of its principal, William McNeill.

With a 1964-65 membership of over 15,000, the Friends of the College became the largest concert series in the South and one of the largest in the United States.

Scott said requests for memberships in next year's series already have come from as far away as Lima, Peru and Danville, Va., and in North Carolina from Charlotte, Boone, and Morehead City.

Scott urged interested music lovers to get in touch with their area "colonel" before the March 15 deadline. No memberships will be sold after that date, he said.
