Active pallbearers were: Henry Keith, Early Keith, Roy Looper, Jesse Crutchfield, James Williams, Eric Holmes.

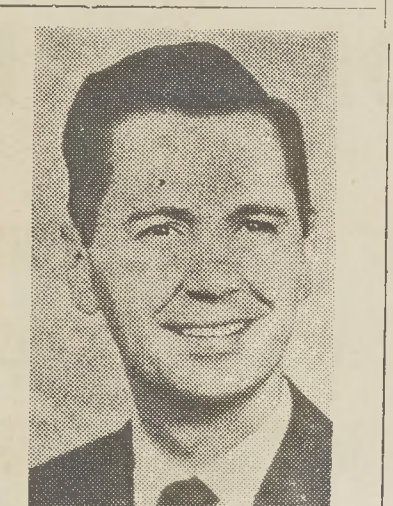
### Funeral Services Held Wednesday For C. R. Barham

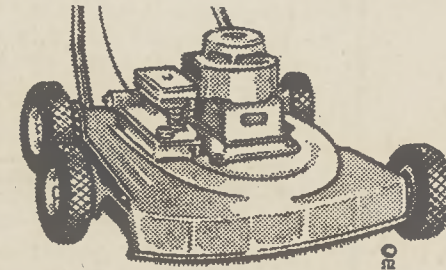

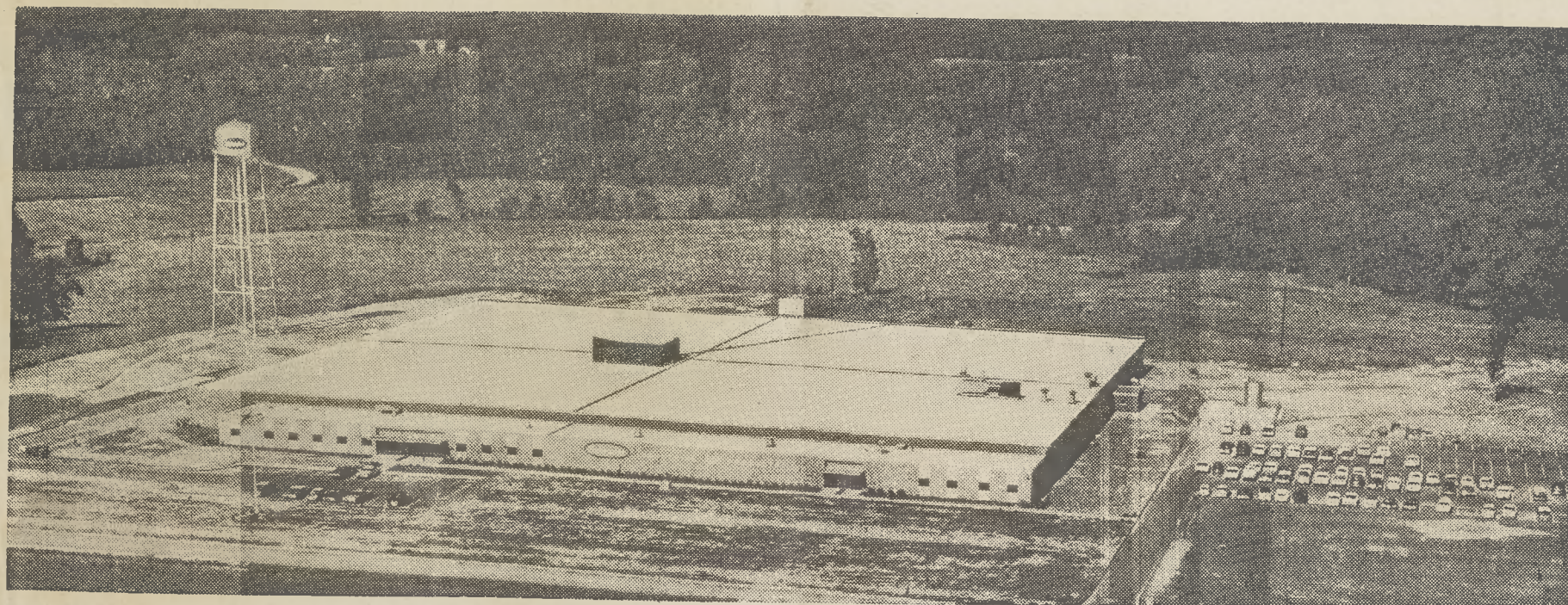
