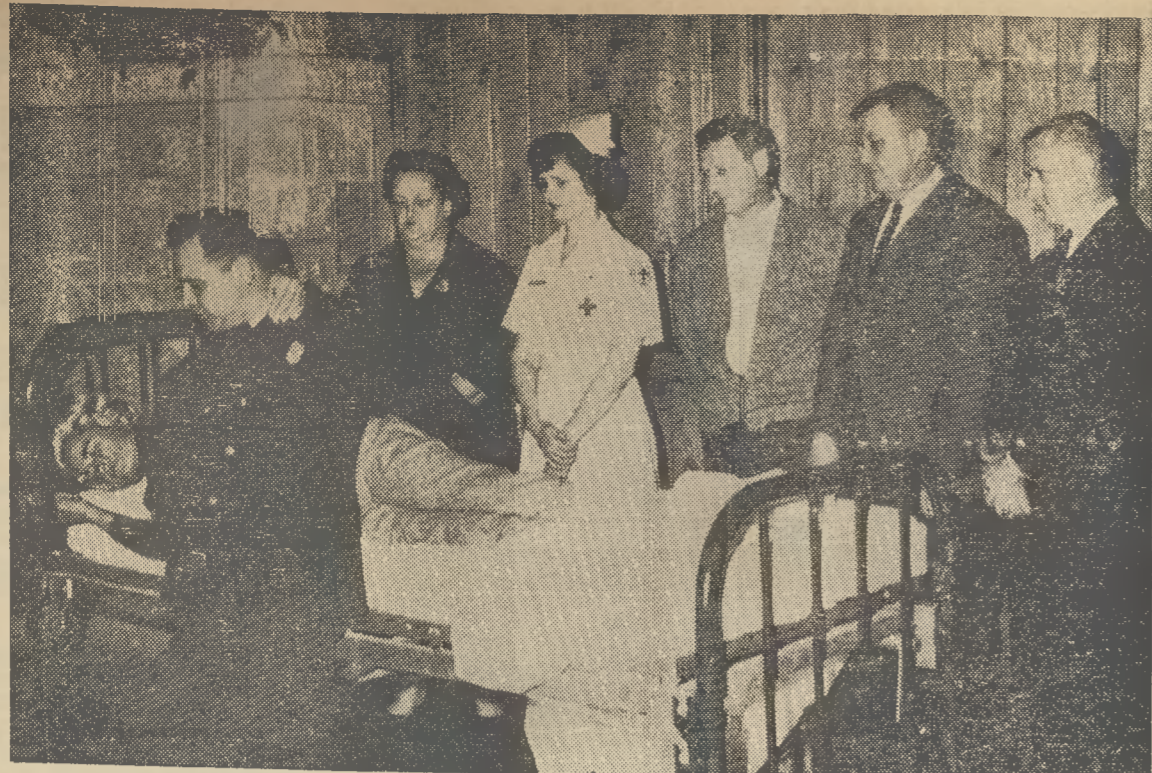


Wake Forest Elem.

Tuesday, November 23, Mr. A. R. "Woodie" Woodlif, Fire Inspector of the Raleigh Fire Department (spoke to a group of some 60 persons from the Wake Forest area regarding fire fighting and patient evacuation.

Groups represented were Wake Forest Hospital, Wake Forest Rest Home, Roger's Nursing Home, Colonial Guest Home, Adult Red Cross Hospital Volunteers, the Volunteer Fire Departments of the area and the Rescue Squad.

The meeting was held at the Community House. After a brief lecture by Mr. Woodlif a film on hospital fires was presented followed by instructions and practice of patient evacuation. Fire fighting equipment was demonstrated and practiced.

Mr. Woodlif, a member of the Fire Department in Raleigh, has worked diligently with Fire Programs in hospitals and schools in the Raleigh area. Since our local hospital is a branch of the Memorial Hospitals of Wake Co. in Raleigh Wake Forest has the privilege of sharing Mr. Woodlif's knowledge and instruction. The hospital felt that this privilege should be shared with the community.
