approval because the project will provide a modern facility to replace the existing sub-standard highway and is not expected to cause any significant adverse effect on the quality of human environment. The major relocation of

the highway is due to the Falls Lake Project.

The portions of the highway which are not relocated will be improved and leveled. Morton explained they will build up the roadway where necessary. Garrett also said if building it up is not sufficient, they will tear out the present roadbed and replace it. The roller-coaster bumps will be ironed out and bad curves straightened.

Right-of-way acquisition could begin after April of 1976 and construction bids let after July 1978.

Garrett emphasized that after the design is approved, the right of way will be staked so property owners can see how it will affect their land. Then each land owner will be contacted individually.

Garrett also explained Relocation Advisory Assistance and had booklets available for those interested. §

## Rolesville radar equipped, ready

The operational license has been received, warning signs are up in Rolesville, and the town's new speed radar unit will soon be used to catch speeders, according to Police Chief Louis Pearce.

"Although I have yet to give any tickets because of the radar, I have already seen a decrease in the amount of speeding because of the warning signs," Pearce said. The town received the radar from the state, which is supplying them to as many police departments as it can

upon request. The unit mounts in the window of a car with the speed registering on a screen on the dash. It can clock the speed of a car going in either direction. Pearce took special training in use of the equipment this spring in Wake Forest.

# 1976 Wake County Property Listing

Wake County property listing schedule for 1976 ad valorem (real and personal property) tax purposes will begin January 2, 1976. Listing by mail will be permitted, and listing statements are being mailed to taxpayers of record. Newcomers to Wake County and those listing for the first time should contact the office of the Tax Supervisor for assistance. If assistance is needed, the tax lister in your township will assist; but observe instructions and present the listing statement.

List takers will be available in townships according to the following schedule between January 19, 1976, and February 16, 1976. After February 16, 1976, listing statements must either be completed and mailed or listed at Room 803, Wake County Courthouse, Raleigh, North Carolina. If listings are not made properly by March 1, a 10% late list penalty will be imposed.

## Notice To Property Owners WAKE COUNTY

Listing of property owned (both real and tangible personal property) as of January 1, 1976, will begin on January 2, 1976. Listing by mail is permitted for Wake County and property owners of record will receive "Listing Statements" early in January 1976 to be completed and returned to "Wake County Tax Supervisor, Room 803, Courthouse, Raleigh, North Carolina 27601."

The "Listing Period" has been extended by the Board of County Commissioners through March 1, 1976, and assistance will be available in Room 803, Courthouse, if needed. Newcomers to Wake County should contact this office for assistance or listing statements for compliance with the North Carolina Statutes.

List takers will be available for assistance at "Listing Stations" in several townships from January 19 to February 16. A list of the various "Listing Stations" will be published this month. After February 16, 1976, all listing statements must either be completed and mailed or listed at Room 803, Wake County Courthouse, Raleigh, North Carolina.

Property not listed by March 1, 1976, is subject to a 10% late list penalty.
