Parents to Speak

The parents of 17-year old Becky Bell, who died from an illegal abortion in 1988, will speak in Asheville Thursday, April 11 at 7:30 PM at the Unitarian Universalist Church, 1 Edwin Place (corner of Charlotte and Edwin).

Karen and Bill Bell have traveled the country speaking out against parental consent laws for unmarried minors since the death of their daughter. The Bells, residents of Indiana, where strict enforcement of parental notification laws exists, grieve for their daughter, whom they believe died because of a law designed to punish young women. The Bells' visit to Asheville will be a final appearance in North Carolina. They plan

to spend several days with legislators in Raleigh, as well as visiting Greensboro, Charlotte, and Greenville.

The North Carolina legislature is expected to debate minors' access restrictions in this session. Currently North Carolina has no parental consent requirement.
