FIRE SCHOOLS

From fire pump operations to breathing apparatus, members of the Protection Department at Pisgah Forest are being reschooled in a 12-week fire training program lasting through mid-November.

John Bishop, protection supervisor, opened the classes to members of the fire brigades, particularly for a refresher on the use of fire extinguishers and classes of fire. Other topics are handling hose and nozzles and flammable liquids.

Meanwhile, Bishop and others from Olin — Luke Harrison, Lewis Curlee and Fritz Merrell — were involved in mid-September as co-hosts with the Brevard Fire Department of the annual Western North Carolina Fire Service Training School.
