Sets New Record FILM PLANT EXCEEDS 5,000,000 INJURY-FREE WORKER HOURS

The cellophane plant of the Ecusta Paper and Film Group at Pisgah Forest set a new record for itself May 4 with completion of 5,000,000 injury-free worker hours.

North Carolina Labor Commissioner John Brooks spoke June 1 at a luncheon honoring employees of the film operation for what he termed a monumental safety achievement. He quoted from an editorial in The Asheville Times May 7 following announcement of the milestone:

"Olin obviously has a safety program that works. If the efforts of most other companies were so successful, the country probably never would have heard of the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration."

The five million milestone represented 1,278 days without disabling injury, dating from November 3, 1973. Shortly after passing the mark Plant Manager Donald Parker issued a statement commending the accomplishment:

"I wish to thank all personnel of the Pisgah Forest film plant, and to



particularly express my appreciation to the Union and to Jimmy Reese for their support and dedication to the Company safety program."

Winner of the Best In Olin plant safety contest last year, the Pisgah Forest film plant represented the Ecusta Paper and Film Group in the 1977 contention for the Olin plant having the best accident prevention program. This is the plant's third

year of representing the Group in the Best in Olin contest.

The plant also was awarded the National Safety Council's Award of Honor for its accident free record November 3, 1973 through December 31, 1976, at which time the injury-free hours totaled 4,558,028.
