All traveling and local preachers in the district, Superintendents of Sunday-schools and lay delegates are required by law to be present.

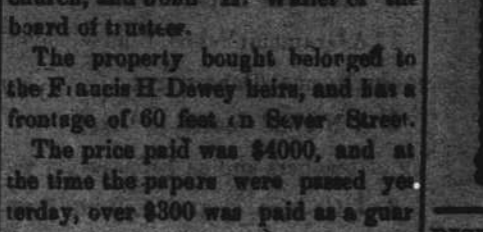
Each pastor will please collect \$1.50 from his charge; meet the expenses of the conference and to pay delegates way to the Annual Conference.
