Mr. Editor: As there has come nothing from this work for a long, long time, doubtless some of the many readers of our church organ would like to know, in the name of the Lord, what about Mowing Glade and Roseville churches. Well, ye scribe was assigned to this new field December 7, 1896.

On our first visit to Roseville we found our church here in a very poor condition, spiritually and temporally, having had two pastors during the past year, which thing, as you know, is generally hurtful or destructive to any church. This state of affairs was brought about on the account of some misunderstanding on the part of the former pastor and the people; hence a general gloom overshadowed the entire church.

Seeing these things, we in the name of God, went forth and re-organized the Sabbath-school and church choir and caused it to be known throughout the town of Matthews that the Gospel was again being preached at Roseville A. M. E. Zion church; and now we have preaching, class-meeting and Sunday-school. Thus you see the sun is rising. We had a grand time at both churches on Easter; the program was nicely rendered and all expressed themselves as having had a rare treat.

Mowing Glade, this church is o. k. On our first visit to this place we found the church in a ceiling process, but moving very slowly. Ye scribe was much astonished, especially, to see Mowing Glade church in such a sad condition; however, we called the board together, spoke very commendably of the good work begun by the trustees, urged its completion, and when the first quarter was held, Feb. 6, 7, the church was beautifully ceiled, and has glass windows over the front doors; and in addition thereto several new pews have been put in. O, it just looks handsome now.

LINCOLN MEMORIAL CHURCH.

Finest Structure Ever Built for Use of the Colored Race.

The finest church ever built for the use of the colored race is soon to be erected in Springfield, Ill., as a monument to the great emancipator. It will be known as the Lincoln Memorial African M. E. Church. The superstructure is to be built of Bedford stone, and will be covered with a slate roof. There will be an auditorium which will hold 700 people, a Sunday school room which can be thrown into an auditorium, giving the whole space a capacity of 1500; a reading-room, a library, a gymnasium and a night school. A memorial-room and a museum will be provided which will contain relics of slavery, such as the auction block, the slave chain, the manacles and the whipping post. There also will be...

seen the obverse of the picture; that is, a collection of books by negro authors and other signs of the character growth of the race since its emancipation. Above the memorial-room will be a large triple window containing life-size figures of Lincoln, Frederick Douglass and John Brown. Other ornamental windows will symbolize the history and progress of the negro race in America. Twenty-eight windows will be named in honor of great abolitionists, American and foreign, and of a few prominent Illinoisans. The material for the pulpit will be brought from Harper's Ferry, while the pulpit chairs will be made of material from Lincoln's old home at New Salem, Ill. The entire cost of the church is estimated at \$25,000.
