## A DISTRICT SECRETARY'S PART IN THE SUCCESS OF MISSION WORK.

Secretary has in the work. Looking faithfully after the financial condition of each auxiliary is a neavy responsibility of the Secretary. She must receive reports from each Treasurer and each Corresponding Secretary every quarter; go over every item with utmost care to avoid the slightest error; then all items must be tabulated and reports sent promptly to Conference officers. To make a success of the work receipts must be sent promptly to each auxiliary Treasurer, for the business of the mission work should be done just as accurately and systematically as that of the secular world.

The pledge for the District is made by the Secretary at each annual Conference, and the full payment of the pledge is of vital importance to her. No doubt auxillaries almost grow impatient sometimes because of the oft repeated request for the pledge to be paid in full. But the Council looks to the Conference for the pledge, and the Conference looks hard at the District Secretary if she fails in that which she has promised.

Another vital part a Secretary has in mission work is in presenting the Missionary Voice and the Young Christian Worker and obtaining subscribers for each. Through these channels the knowledge of our work and workers is largely obtained. Then she should send items of mission news-new plans well tested and found good-and any other interesting facts, to the Church paper for publication.

Finally, if the District Secretary will "study to show herself approved of God, a workman that needeth not be ashamed"; if she will make the mission work the every day business of her life, having her heart bubbling ever with love for the work and the workers; and if she communes earnestly and frequently with

God to know His plan her part will be a large one in the success of the work and the promotion of His Kingdom over the earth.


