THE DIAZ TROOPS TO CRUSH REVOLT

Government Soldiers Plan to Trap Rebels in Mountains of Mexico.

MAY BE END OF THE TROUBLE

Troops Hurrying to Zone of Insurrecto Activity-Madero Reported in Mexican Territoy-An Attack Soon.

Mexico City, Dec. 20 .- The tenth battalion of infantry, a battery of six light artillery, mountain guns; and one rapid fire gun, left here today in two special trains for the zone of insurrecto activity in Chiahuahua. Another train carrying two regiments of infantry is said to have left Guadalajara last night for the same destina-

The force from this city is in command of General Sanchez Rivera and Col. Rafael Lis, and is said to be intended to reinforce Col. Guzman at Pedernales.

According to official information the government forces are preparing te deliver a crushing blow to the revbutionists. The situation is said to be as follows:

On one side of the valley of Malpato (bad pass) is the force of General Navarro, numbering 1,000 men. Col. Guzman is on the other side with a ders to wait for reinforcements.

Troops are being hurried to the front to raise the force of Col. Guzman to 1,000 men and then the attack will be made from two sides. In high official circles, it is believed that the rebels are now trapped be yond hope of escape.
