AN IMPORTANT EXPERIMENT.

Projectile Fired in Hampton Roads Penetrated Armor Plate.

Washington, Nov. 11.-The projec-Davis cannon torpedo at the submerged caisson representing the side of a battleship apparently succeeded in penetrating the two-inch armor plate which had been placed on the outside of the caisson. The caisson quickly sank after the shot exploded. The extent of the damage inflicted upon the target cannot be known until the caisson is in dry dock at Norfolk. The experiment is believed to have been of he greatest importance to the navy and it will make necessary a complete revision of the methods of torpedo attack and defense.
