COTTON MARKET UNSETTLED WHEAT MARKET RALLIED STOCKS MAKE GOOD SHOWING

December and January contracts made new high records for the season with December cotton selling at 14.05.

New York, Oct. 23.—Today's cotton market was nervous and unsettled. December and January contracts made new high records for the season, with December cotton selling at 14.05, but offerings showed a tendency to increase on advances, while fluctuations were irregular enough to suggest that the trade was hesitating between the expectation of a reaction after the recent big advance, and a tendency toward a further reduction in crop yields, owing to continued bad weather reports from the South. The market was steady, but several points off from the best, with prices net points higher to points lower, near months being relatively firm.

After Undergoing Considerable Depression Prices Rallied When Increasing Receipts Were Reported.

Chicago, Oct. 23.—After undergoing considerable depression, wheat today rallied. Duluth were explained as being due to temporary cause, the clearing out of many railway side tracks.

In Spite of Severe Break in Prices at Outset Market Made Fairly Good Showing—Banks Show Selling.

New York, Oct. 23.—In spite of a severe break in stocks at the outset today, the market made a fairly good showing.

Reports of heavy rains in the Southwest and bullish Liverpool cables caused an opening advance of 5 to 9 points, but the market met heavy realizations from the Southwest, combined with the unsettled state of affairs in Bombay, and rather a less favorable view of the Mexican situation, which caused a heavy reaction, and a net loss of 5 to 9 points during the middle of the day.
