NEW ORLEANS COTTON

Selling Pressure Bears on Market But Prices Hold Their Own.

New Orleans, Jan. 14 .- While considerable selling pressure was put on turpentine. he cotton market today, prices held their own fairly well and the close was net loss of only 4 to 5 points. At the lowest of the day prices were to 7 points down. Exports were small, only 1,645 bales from all United States ports and somewhat less inquiry per bu. Sweet potatoes, yams, 80 @ 90c. was reported for spots but there was per bu. not enough selling at any time to bring about a pronounced break.




