COTTON MARKET NERVOUS

Prices Went Lower Under Scattered Liquidation—Unsettled Conditions But Close Was Steady.

New York, April 27. — Cotton was nervous, and unsettled today, with prices lower, under scattered liquidation, local and foreign selling. Closed steadily at a decline of 8 to 11 points.

At the decline of about 28 points from high levels of last week, offerings became less active and last prices were several points up from the lowest on short covering and a scattering demand, which may have been inspired by expectations of a bullish weekly weather report tomorrow.
