AGREE WITH U. S. TO EXTEND RECOGNITION TO CARRANZA PARTY

Argentina, Brazil and Chile in Accord With Decision of Conference.
VILLA WILL FIGHT ON
However, His Cause Will be Weakened, When Embargo is Placed on Arms.
Recognition Expected to be Made Within a Week.

Washington, October 10. — Argentina, Brazil and Chile, are in accord with the decision of the United States government to grant recognition to the party led by General Carranza as the de facto government in Mexico, according to official advices here. The form in which recognition is to be accorded has not been decided, but it may be done by formal notification of Eliseo Arredondo, authorized representative here of the Carranza government. Extension of recognition is expected within a week, and will result in an immediate embargo on arms against factions opposed to the Carranza government, a step which will materially weaken the resources of the Villa element, which intends to continue the fight in Mexico.

Says Supremacy is Temporary.
Miguel Diaz Lombardo gave out a statement tonight in behalf of the Villa faction declaring that while it is not the intention of the United States that the Carranza party's supremacy be temporary, it is the intention of the Carranza party to recognize a revolutionary faction, nevertheless it is intended to contribute by further military operations to the Carranza party's supremacy as temporary.

Protection for Foreigners.
Although the documents presented to Secretary Lansing and the Pan-American conference by Eliseo Arredondo on which the decision to recognize the Carranza party was based, have not been made public, it became known today that the first chief had given explicit assurances with reference to protection of foreigners, claims amnesty for political offenses and the treatment of the clergy.

MUST LOOK TO CARRANZA
Villa Announces He is No Longer Responsible for Safety of Foreigners.
El Paso, Texas, Oct. 10.—General Villa's formal declaration to General C. Goethals, special agent of the State Department at Washington, that because of the recognition of the Carranza government he would not hold himself responsible for the safety of their lives and property of foreigners, today, created little apprehension of immediate danger to foreigners.

CARRANZA PLEASED OVER THE DECISION

Telegrams From Washington Read in the Theatres.
PEOPLE ARE ENTHUSED
Chief Says Recognition of His Government Will Add Moral Strength to Institutional and Disheartened Revolutionists.

Vera Cruz, Oct. 10.—General Carranza received with great pleasure the news that the Pan-American conference at Washington had decided to recommend recognition of the party led by him as the de facto government in Mexico. Telegrams from Carranza agents at Washington brought the news, and the first chief was congratulated by his associates. The Washington telegrams were read in the theatres and received with great enthusiasm. General Carranza will not alter his plans for a trip through northern states, beginning tomorrow.

JOY IN MEXICO CITY

BULGARIA'S BOUND BY SECRET TREATY
