> Secretary Are Denied.


Rome, August 12 .- Reports from foreign countries that Monsignor Freder-Gasparri as the Papal secretary of state were denied today at the Vatican. It was stated at the Vatican that Cardinal Gasparri enjoys the full confidence of Pope Benedict and that no change in the office of secretary of state has taken plac.

The official French oureau of information in New York made public August 10, a cable message, received from Paris indicating that Monsignor Tedeschini, the under-secretary of state at the Vatican, had succeeded Cardinal Gasparri as Pope Benedict's prime minister. The Rome correspondent of a Madrid newspaper, according to the message to the French bureau of information, quoted Monsignor Tedeschini, whom he described as the "new secretary of state of the Vatican," as declaring for "a peace of justice."

There had been reports that Cardinal Gasparr had resigned, but the semiofficial Vatican organ denied that the Cardinal had retired.


