COTTON SLIGHTLY HIGHER CORN PRICES SET BACK STOCKS MAKE IMPROVEMENT

Better View is Taken of the Stock Market Situation and the News From the Italian Theatre.

New York, Nov. 2.—Cotton was less active today. Fluctuations were irregular enough to suggest continued nervousness, but the price movements were less violent and the tone was generally steady.

Unsettled Trade Situation and Augmented Receipts of New Grain Cause a Decline.

Chicago, Nov. 2.—Corn prices underwent a decided setback today, influenced to a large extent by the generally unsettled trade situation and by augmented receipts of new grain.

No Hysteria is Evident as a Result of the Restrictions Placed Upon Short Selling.

New York, Nov. 2.—An extraordinary change came over the stock market today in consequence of stringent measures adopted by the authorities of that institution to restrict speculative operations as far as possible.
