COTTON DROPS AGAIN CORN STRENGTHENED STOCKS YIELD AGAIN

Opening Break is Followed by Rallyes But the Market Turns Weak Toward the Close. Chicago, Nov. 13.—Assurances that food relief for Europe from America would be systematically enlarged had a strengthening effect today on the corn market.

New York, Nov. 13.—The aggressive selling movement which started yesterday was checked today by orders from Washington that no further short sales for speculative account be permitted in the cotton market. A big opening break was followed by rallies in consequence, but the market weakened again later under renewed liquidation and the close was barely steady at a net decline of 90 to 175 points.

Peace and Its Attendant Problems Bring About Another Period of Liquidation. New York, Nov. 13.—Peace and its attendant problems and uncertainties loomed larger on the financial horizon today, the stock market undergoing another period of liquidation which encompassed nearly all parts of the active list.

The decline was accelerated by further restriction of credits and the attitude of conservative banking interests who encouraged general curtailment of speculative accounts despite the more hopeful views of leaders in the steel industry.

Speculative favorites were at lowest prices in the later dealings but rallied from fractions to 1 1/2 points on support then accorded rails and shippings and the further strength of Mexican Petroleum.

A few of the more popular industrialized approximated minimum quotations of the year during the several reversals, but these also rallied on the relaxation of pressure at the end.
