BIG BREAK IN COTTON CORN PRICES GO UP STOCKS IN SUSPENSE

Final Prices Show a Loss of More Than \$5 a Bale—Market Nervous and Irregular.

New York, Nov. 18.—The violent recoveries of late last week were followed by a very nervous and irregular trading in the cotton market today with a final break of more than \$5 per bale from Saturday's closing figures.
