Manning of South Carolina, head of the Cotton Export corporation movement, and Asson Sapre of California, expert in co-operative marketing, are expected to address and confer with the cotton and tobacco growers of this state at their meetings to be held in Raleigh January 12 and 13.

The North Carolina Tobacco Growers association meets Wednesday, January 12, and the North Carolina division of the American Cotton association Thursday, the 13th. While these are separate and distinct organizations, they have a great deal in common. Both are working toward the same end—that proper and the most efficient marketing facilities may be provided for the principal agricultural products of North Carolina. Their meetings—and these will be strictly business meetings rather than speech-making occasions—have been arranged coincidentally in order that those interested
