

The Greek colony of this city will make no formal observance of today, which, according to the Julian calandar subscribed to by them. is Christmas, but when Greek meets Greek today they will exchange the seasons' greetings in these words: "Ayia Hristonyena." which, translated into English, means Merry Christmas.

Several leading members of the Greek colony were consulted yesterday, and they advised that the Greeks of this city, generally speaking, celebrated Christmas day on December 25, which is according to the Gregorian calandar, or in accordance with the custom of this and other countries for ages.

Because of the fact that there is no resident Greek Orthodox priest here, it was said that there would not be any religious observance of the day in this city. However, in cities where a Greek Orthodox priest is located, the day will be formally observed by divine services and the customary festivities.






