

NEW DRY DOCK OPENED AT FORE RIVER PLANT

Development Gives Boston Facilities Only Available At Navy Yards

(Special to The Star) QUINCY, Mass., Feb. 1.—A new 10,000-ton drydock was opened at the Fore river plant of the Bethlehem Shipbuilding corporation, Ltd., today, when the Calvin Austin, which has been on the New York-Boston run, was drydocked for reconditioning and repairs.

This new development gives the port of Boston facilities that have heretofore been available only in the navy yards. The new dock will take vessels 525 feet overall, with a draft of 27 feet. Although its lifting capacity is rated at 10,000 tons, it will take vessels about 20 per cent in excess of that figure.

The pontoons, each of which is 116 feet long, were built at Solomon's Island, on the Chesapeake, and the 1,700 tons of steel work was fabricated at the Steelton plant of the Bethlehem Steel company. A tug has brought the pontoons up the coast in two or three days, and has been mated to the dock. The pontoons are connected by bridle, with 1,000 feet of sea room between them, so that the last three make a tow nearly three-quarters of a mile long.

In connection with the dock there has been built a concrete mooring pier 50 feet wide by 600 feet long, with a marginal wharf 300 feet long, and also a marginal wharf 300 feet by 500 feet.

DANIELS PAYS LAST VISIT TO THE ANNAPOLIS ACADEMY

ANNAPOLIS, Md., Jan. 31.—There will be no scrapping in the navy, at least in the near future. Daniel's departure from the regiment of midshipmen in an address tonight to the Young Men's Christian association at the naval academy.

Secretary Daniels urged the young future officers not to be alarmed at tales that battleships soon would be supplanted by air fighting craft.

"There is greater reason to ever before for a big navy and a strong navy, both on land and under the sea," Mr. Daniels said. "The navy is to the nation what the gut is to the individual. True they are separate and distinct bodies, but each is a part of the great whole."

The visit of Secretary Daniels today marked his last visit to the academy for in a little more than four weeks he will retire with the Wilson cabinet, and he served reminiscent of the days he has served at the head of the navy.

"I have made a number of trips here," he said, "but this will be my last. I will be glad to retire from public life and get back to the editorial chair and brush up in newspaper writings and there is no doubt I will have much to write about."
